Catherine McAuley was a fearless pioneer, laying the foundations of an educational, healthcare and social network to help those less fortunate. Edmund Rice promoted an education that recognised the dignity of each individual and actively sought opportunities for students to feel empowered by their faith and learning. These values of the Mercy Sisters and Christian Brothers continue to be lived out and witnessed here by your children at St Patrick's.

Your child will have multiple opportunities to participate in aspects of the College including house events, interschool and district representation.



There are many local activities that your child will have the opportunity to participate in as representatives of the College including ANZAC Day ceremonies, International Women's Day and local community projects.


As a student at St Patrick's, your child will have many opportunities to grow holistically in our College family and in the wider community.
