- Tuition Fee and Capital Levy will be charged FOUR TIMES each year • February, April, July and October
- Other Compulsory Levies are charged in Term 1
- Subject based Levies are charged in Semester 1 and Semester 2

Subject Levies – by Year Level. Charged in Semester 1 and Semester 2.

Fostering Talent Providing Challenge Pursuing Wisdom **Certificate Courses:** In recognition of students who undertake a second Vetis course whilst enrolled at St. Patrick's, the College will offer an incentive payment of 50 % of the costs of the second or additional VET subjects up to the value of \$ 600 maximum. This reimbursement payment will be made as a credit of the Term 4 Tuition Fees. In dollar terms, if a VET subject costs \$1,200 @ 50 %, \$ 600 (Full Term 4 Tuition Fees) will be credited. Equally, a subject that costs \$300 will be credited to the value of \$150 tuition fee credit. The subject(s) must attract prior approval of the Principal and the student must achieve a completed and pass standard for the whole of the subject. Credits will only be processed on presentation of receipts and the fulfilment of the pass criteria.

Enrolment Bond: A once only payment of \$100.00. The Bond is FULLY REFUNDABLE when your child departs the College PROVIDED all books and electronic resources owned by St Patrick's College (laptop, hired textbooks as well as library books) are returned; and further if a <u>minimum of one term's</u> <u>attendance</u> at the College is completed.

<u>Administration Fee:</u> A non-refundable fee of \$100.00 charged upon your acceptance of the College Enrolment Offer. This amount is receipted separately and does not show on College Fee statements normally.

<u>Outstanding Fees:</u> Under College Pastoral Board Policy, we have the option to consider Debt Collection if fees remain outstanding more than three (3) School Terms. The only exception that the College normally makes is where there is an ongoing payment arrangement.

Payment Facilities: The College has EFTPOS facilities and accepts Credit Card payments through Qkr!. *Changes to bank processes do not allow credit card details to be taken over the phone*. Bank account Direct Debit is available *free of charge* through the College. Direct Debit forms are available on the Parent Portal. Banks Fees may be charged if a Direct Debit is rejected by your bank.

Qkr! is available for Canteen, Uniform Shop, Fee Payments and other selected payments. These will be advertised during the year on the Parent Portal and College Newsletter. Information may sometimes be available via Facebook – <u>My St Patrick's College</u>

BPAY BPay is available and details of Biller Code and Reference appear on Fee Statements (*minimum payment accepted is \$50.00*).

<u>Capital Levy:</u> Capital Levy is *compulsory* to ensure our College Redevelopment Programme (Masterplan) continues to remain viable. *It is not Tax Deductible*. A 10% Discount is offered to Families with both College and St Patrick's Primary students.

Year Level Camp / Retreat / Activities: Cost of Camps / Retreats / Student Activities for each year level is charged on the Fee Statement, and attendance is **COMPULSORY** for all students. Should a student be unable to attend a refund may be sought. The College <u>MUST</u> receive a request in writing within 3 weeks of the event along with a Doctor's Certificate if your student was ill. A NON-REFUNDABLE Administration Fee is applied to each Camp / Retreat / Activity due to costs incurred by the College for booking buses, venues and other overheads.

<u>e-Learning Levy</u>: This Levy enables the College to continue to provide cutting edge technology and support for students both personally and in classrooms.

Library Fund: All families are invited to contribute to the College Library Fund. This voluntary contribution is receipted separately and is *Tax Deductible*. The paid amount does not appear on your statement.

Book Hire Scheme: Textbook hire is included with the Student Services Levy. Consumable items such as pens / pencils / calculators and materials for Art / Manual Arts / Home Economics are NOT provided. A resource Levy applies for some subjects from Year 9 onwards. The College accesses the bulk payment option of the State Government Textbook and Resource Allowance.

Pro-Rata Fee or Refund: Students enrolled for part of the school year will be charged pro-rata fees.

Fees Concession Policy:

- Families wishing to apply for a Concession on Fees should do so via the Application for Fee Concession Form available on the Parent Portal. We encourage families experiencing financial difficulties to consider this option. Throughout this process the confidentiality of information is guaranteed. Information is only handled by the Principal and Business Manager.
- Parents or guardians requesting concessions must provide evidence of gross income, tax and housing costs. Payslips and Centrelink statements are acceptable proof of income, and rental receipts, bank statements and rates notices are evidence of housing costs.
- Where the Principal is satisfied with the documentary evidence provided, a concession may be granted without an interview.
- > If there is a perceived problem on the part of either party, an interview may take place.
- The application and / or interview process is aimed at determining a just and equitable fee, within the families' ability to pay.
- No allowance is made for repayments on items such as holiday houses, luxury cars, investment houses, pools and the like.
- Once a fee concession is granted it is essential that this commitment is honoured in full and on time. Our preferred method of payment for concession families is Direct Debit. If family circumstances change the college must be informed.
- > New Fee Concession arrangements need to be negotiated each school year.
- Unless prior arrangements are made the College expects that agreed fees will be paid by the due date. If there is a problem in meeting this provision, a letter of explanation should be sent to the Principal or Business Manager.

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
